

## ORDINANCE NO. 921

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 1, OF CHAPTER 17 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MEADE, KANSAS, AMENDING THE UTILITY BUDGET PAY PROGRAM FOR RESIDENTIAL UTILITY SERVICES WITHIN THE CITY OF MEADE, KANSAS, AND REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF MEADE:

**SECTION 1.** Section 23.4 of Article 1 of Chapter 17 of the Code of the City of Meade, Kansas is hereby amended to include the following:

17.1.23.4      Adjustments. Adjustments to the budget pay amount shall be made by the City Clerk if it is determined that the account is accruing either too large a deficit or too large a credit. No account shall carry more than a \$300.00 outstanding balance. If an account accrues \$300.00 or more in deficit, the customer shall be required to make a suitable payment to bring the account below the \$300.00 balance limit.

**SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its summary of publication in the Official City Newspaper.
